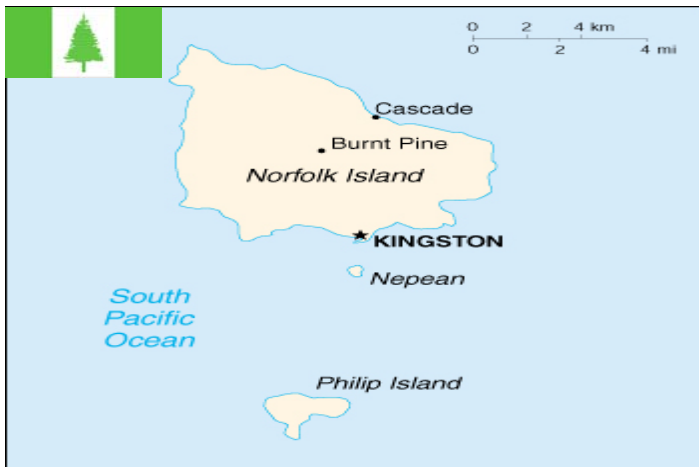


NORFOLK ISLAND

Background: Two British attempts at establishing the island as a penal colony (1788-1814 and 1825-55) were ultimately abandoned. In 1856, the island was resettled by Pitcairn Islanders, descendants of the Bounty mutineers and their Tahitian companions.

Location: Oceania, island in the South Pacific Ocean, east of Australia

Economy: Tourism, the primary economic activity, has steadily increased over the years and has brought a level of prosperity unusual among inhabitants of the Pacific islands. The agricultural sector has become self-sufficient in the production of beef, poultry, and eggs.

Industries: tourism

Currency: 1 Australian dollar (\$) = 100 cents

Railways: 0 km

Highways: total: 80 km paved: 53 km unpaved: 27 km

Waterways: none

Ports and Harbors: none; loading jetties at Kingston and Cascade

Visa: Not required by bona fide tourists staying less than 30 days with return or onward tickets and sufficient funds for length of stay. However an Entry Permit is required by all nationals, which is granted on arrival (except to nationals of New Zealand and Australia who only require a passport).

Duty Free: The following items can be imported into Norfolk Island by persons of 18 years of age or older without incurring customs duty: 200 cigarettes or 50 cigars or 227g of tobacco; 1 bottle of spirits; 1 bottle of wine.

Health: A yellow fever certificate is required from all travelers over one year of age arriving from infected areas. Drinking water is from natural spring and rainwater and is considered safe to drink.
